Membership Approves Change to the VFGPA Bylaws

Over fifty members attended the special called meeting of the VFGPA on Monday May 14th 2007. Set to discuss the possible changing of the bylaws and the concept of using borrowed money to pay for our clubhouse repairs, this special meeting was called by the club executive and advertised in the bulletin to meet requirements.

A motion to change the bylaws was presented and seconded and the pros and cons were weighed. All present engaged in a quality debate showing there is a strong member interest in the future of the club and how it is run today. After thirty minutes of debate the question was called and resulted in 44 in favour, 6 against and 0 abstentions. This provides sufficient majority to change the bylaws. For those not aware of the approved wording change here is the old and new section from the bylaws:

Under Finances in section 7 the Bylaws used to read:

The Association shall have no power to borrow moneys.

This has now been officially struck and amended to read:

The Association shall have the power to borrow money on the approval of the members at a special called meeting where due notice is given, there is quorum present and the intent of the monies use is described. (14 May 2007)

The other topics debated and voted on were borrowing up to\$ 200,000 for the repair of the clubhouse and the starting of the final phase of the Multi-Purpose Range completion. And an approval for the executive to discuss and weigh the use Chris Welch Contracting to repair the clubhouse.

Please be sure to note that this change approved for the bylaws does NOT give the executive the opportunity to borrow money as and when they please. There are checks and balances in place that require the membership to approve borrowing today and in the future.

President's June Message

The warm weather is back and the 3-foot plus of snowfall we had last November seems such a distant memory. Sitting at home chilled to the bone for three days without electricity was perhaps just a bad dream. Well the evidence of a harsh and stormy winter is still quite visible all around the Holker Place property even though the weather has vastly improved; many wind blown tree branches and debris still need to be cleaned up.

Ironically, after so much rain this past five months; we now need to focus on avoiding forest fires. With the onset of much warm weather during summer, we must also be mindful of fires on our ranges due to bullets creating sparks and also driving slowly when on the property to avoid creating huge dust clouds.

So I urge all of us to act in a safety conscious manner at the property this summer. Please do not use bullets that could create fires down range, please do not shoot at metal gongs in areas where sparks could ignite the foliage or ground cover around the gong and of course if you see any hint of fire down range it is vitally important to report it and attempt to extinguish it swiftly before it gets out of control.

With an increase in the membership base (VFGPA has no surpassed the 1000 members mark already this year), we will also experience a greater use of the club ranges by our members. While this is very positive for the club, we must seriously consider that the more people using the ranges the greater the need there is for being safety conscious, abiding by the rules and being courteous to others on the property.

Also be mindful that paper targets are standard our range and it is against VFGPA range rules to shoot at tin cans, plastic bottles, glass, rocks, and old computer equipment. Plus it is regarded as vandalism to purposefully shoot at the club's metal target supports. The metal targets that you personally bring to the range MUST be pre-approved by the caretaker before use. If you witness others breaking these rules, please advise them in a polite and non-confrontational manner that are not adhering to the VFGPA rules or notify the caretaker of the infraction.

I have struck a committee to look into our property use policy, range rules and member etiquette. With greater membership and increased property use, we must at all costs make safety our first priority and having personally reviewed the current rules as well as hearing of some minor instances on the ranges, I feel that we can improve them for the benefit of all. I indicated to the committee that ALL members are to receive a copy of the new updated range rules to ensure they are informed about any changes.

Additionally, we will have copies clearly available in various locations at the ranges especially for non-members.

So I ask again that this summer we are all mindful of avoiding fires on the ranges, enjoying the property in a safe way within the rules that does not spoil others enjoyment of the property. So thank you in advance for your consideration to keeping VFGPA Malahat Outdoor Centre a great and safe facility plus let me close by wishing everyone a wonderful summer.

Public Angling Access To Humpback Reservoir

The following letter dated May 01, 2007 was sent to CRD Parks by the Victoria Fish & Game Protective Association:

I am writing on behalf of the more than 1000 members of the Victoria Fish & Game Protective Association to open discussion with the CRD over developing full public angling opportunity on Humpback Reservoir. The VFGPA has existed as a strong voice for outdoor recreation opportunities and the conservation and wise use of fish and wildlife resources on Vancouver Island since 1919. We are one of 140 fish and game clubs in the Province that comprise the 30,000 member B.C. Wildlife Federation.

One of the main influences in our interest in achieving public angling on Humpback Reservoir is the fact that in the last year or so the private logging interests of the E and N land belt have closed nearly all their gates to public access.

Thus there is no longer open access during non-operating days for anglers to fish the several dozen quality trout lakes found on these private forest lands that previously had been accessible to anglers for several decades. On top of the E and N forest lands being closed, the CRD closure of access to some of the previously popular lakes in the Sooke area has been an additional blow to anglers. These two sources of locked gates prevent the Freshwater Fisheries Society of B.C. from access to over 20 lakes that have a long history of being stocked with trout.

A second major element influencing our interest in angling opportunity for Humpback Reservoir is the provincial government's commitment to providing, as the Premier has said, "the best managed fisheries in the world – bar none".

The Ministry of Environment has an active policy goal of significantly increasing the number of freshwater anglers in British Columbia and has developed partnerships with many fishing NGO's including fish and game clubs and the Freshwater Fisheries Society of B.C.

Thus we see on Vancouver Island (and the rest of the Province) the introduction of fishing to children, youth and families via 'Family Fishing Weekend' and 'Learn to Fish' events.

We have been in contact with both the regional fisheries staff of MOE in Nanaimo and the FFSBC staff at the Duncan hatchery and in Victoria. Trevor Andrews, small lakes biologist for Vancouver Island, says that the Ministry would be supportive of Humpback Reservoir being accessible for public angling. Prior to being placed on the stocking list, complete lake survey would need to be conducted. This is routine for any new lake being proposed for stocking. Dan Hayward, Superintendent of Duncan hatchery and Don Peterson, President of FFSBC, tell us that they would be prepared to provide trout once Humpback is put on the regional stocking list.

Our knowledge of Humpback Reservoir indicates a number of positive aspects towards a goal of public fishing:

- Located at south end of Sooke park area, control of access would be easy.
- Good access via Humpback Road.
- Parking is already available.
- Old caretaker house could be converted to a children's learning centre for fishing and stewardship.
- The dam appears to require minimum work and could be used for fishing by kids, seniors and the physically challenged.
- Potential for a boat launch ramp.
- The existing dock might be improved for use as fishing dock.

We view this project as a great opportunity to partnership with CRD and the FFSBC. I look forward to your response and hopefully moving ahead with more discussions.

Father and Son guilty on four counts under Wildlife Act

FORT ST. JOHN – A Surrey man and his son, a Saskatchewan resident, pleaded guilty to a total of four counts under the B.C. Wildlife Act in Fort St. John Provincial Court on April 30, 2007.

Larry Groves and his son Chris were charged under the Wildlife Act for the illegal harvest of **two elk, a moose, a goat and a ram**. The offences took place in the Muskwa Kechika area near Gathto Creek in September 2005, with charges laid after a nine-month investigation by members of the Conservation Officer Service.

In addition to six- and four-year hunting prohibitions, respectively, Larry and Chris Groves face combined fines totalling \$15,000, of which \$13,700 will be allocated to the Habitat Conservation Trust Fund. The seized wildlife was forfeited to the Crown.

The maximum penalty for a first offence conviction under the B.C. Wildlife Act is \$50,000 or imprisonment for a term of six months, or both. Administrative sanctions may also be imposed.

Illegal hunting and fishing activities threaten provincial fish and wildlife resources. Environment Minister Barry Penner encourages the public to report all poachers and polluters by calling 1-877-952-RAPP (7277), #RAPP (7277) on the TELUS Mobility Network, or by visiting the website at: www.rapp.bc.ca

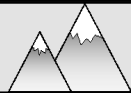

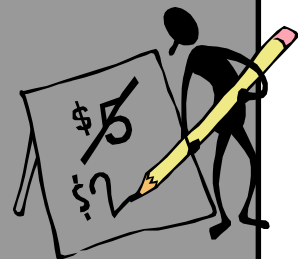
